

PROPOSITION 65 STATEMENT

January 2024

Subject: Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. Exposure to these chemicals may take place when products are acquired or used. Exposure may also occur in homes, workplaces, or other environments in California. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list was first published in 1987 and must be updated at least once a year. It now includes over 900 chemicals.

Proposition 65 became law in November 1986, when California voters approved it by a 63-37 percent margin. The official name of Proposition 65 is the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986.

This letter is to inform you, in compliance with CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY OFFICE OF ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH HAZARD ASSESSMENT SAFE DRINKING WATER AND TOXIC ENFORCEMENT ACT OF 1986 (Proposition 65), that aluminum and zinc alloys produced by Allied Metal Company may contain some of the substances listed. While contained in alloy chemistry, they are in accordance with the standards of ASTM and do not pose any known health risks at their minimal levels. Safety Data Sheets provide additional information for safe handling procedures and are available per your request.

Per ASTM B179-18, B240-21, and B892-10 (Chemical elements contained are less than .1000%)

- Cadmium .005% Max
- Chromium metallic (non-hexavalent) – negligible < .1000%
- Lead metallic - < .005% in Zinc and < .10% in Aluminum
- Nickel
